


RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACCOMMODATION

Dear potential participants of the MAINTENANCE 2022 Conference, In order to help you with your preferred accommodation in Budva, which is also one of the top Mediterranean tourist destinations in September, we give you some recommendations:

- > If you want to be located near the sea and about 800 1200 m from the Conference Center, we recommend the hotels Slovenska plaža (3 *), Mogren (3 *), Tre Cane (4 *), Bracera (4 *), Avala (5 *) and Splendid-Bečići (5 *);
- If you prefer a quieter part of the city of Budva, which is closer to the Conference Center (up to 100m) and 800-1000 m away from the sea, we recommend: Apartments Twister, Le Marc guest house, Boutique Hotel Momentum by Aycon,
- > The city of Budva is full of private rooms or apartments in different locations.

The city of Budva offers you an abundance of interesting cultural and historical sights in the city and the surrounding area. Numerous travel agencies offer you daily cheap trips to the following destinations:

- > Cetinje (old capital of Montenegro) 35 km
- > Skadar lake (boat tour) 45 km
- > City of Skhodra in Albania (castle) 65 km
- > Dubrovnik Croatia (old city under UNESCO protection) 90 km
- > Ulcinj i Ada Bojana (Castlle and old city) 65 km
- > Bar (Castle and old city) 40 km



BUDVA – IN SHORT

Budva is a Montenegrin town on the Adriatic Sea. It has 19,218 inhabitants, and it is the centre of Budva Municipality. The coastal area around Budva, called the Budva riviera, is the center of Montenegrin tourism, known for its well-preserved medieval walled city, sandy beaches and diverse nightlife. Budva is 2,500 years old, which makes it one of the oldest settlements on the Adriatic coast. Extensive archaeological evidence places Budva among the oldest urban settlements of the Adriatic coast. Substantial documentary evidence provides historical references dating back to the 5th century BC. A legend recounts that Bouthoe (- Bouthoē) was founded by Cadmus, the founder of Thebes, Greece, when exiled out of Thebes, finding a shelter in this place for him and his wife, goddess Harmonia. The Old Town of Budva is situated on a rocky peninsula, on the southern end of Budva field. Archaeological evidence suggests that Illyrian settlement was formed on the site of the Old Town before Greek colonization of the Adriatic. While the site was permanently settled since Roman era, most of existing city walls and buildings were erected during the Venetian rules. This city has been known as a tourist destination for a long time - the first tourists arrived here again. 1923. years, and today Budva is often called the metropolis of tourism; because it is the most visited destination in Montenegro and one of the most visited in the Adriatic. What attracts people and brings them to Budva is first and foremost something that nature has given to this area, and it has given it the unique beauty of the sun, sea and a string of pearl beaches at the foot of gigantic mountains.
